ASIAN COMMUNITY GAMES 2010 – CRICKET PROGRAM

Rules:

- The official tournament ball will be a hard ball provided by the organizers of the tournament
- The wicket will be provided by the organizers of the tournament
- Each game will have two certified umpires from the Toronto Cricket Umpire Association
- Each team must have 11 players and can have a maximum of 5 team members in special roles e.g. coach, reserve players
- Each team is responsible for bringing their equipment e.g. bats, helmets, gloves etc.
- Each game will be a two-innings, 5 overs match
- If there is a tie, each team will respectively play an extra over
- All teams must have uniforms
- All teams must be present at the parade of the Opening Ceremony
- No player can bowl for more than one over
- The umpires have the final say in all decisions
- Failure to comply with the rules of the tournament or the Asian Community games in general will result in disqualification for the team

Game Information:

The cricket program will be a round-robin tournament. The 16 teams that sign up will be divided into groups of four. Each team will play every other team in their group, so there are 3 games at least guaranteed for each team.

The best two teams from each group will move on to the playoffs. At this point, the tournament is single-elimination style. Each playoff team will be randomly

matched with another team in the quarter-final, and the winning teams in each round will move on to the next round.

The winner of the tournament will receive a trophy and medals, while the 2nd and 3rd place teams will receive only medals

Trophies and Prizes:

A trophy will be awarded to the winner of the tournament

Medals will be awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place teams

Eligibility:

There is no age limit and all teams that have made the full payment before the deadline can participate

Equipment:

All teams are responsible for bringing their own equipment e.g. bats, uniforms

Entry Fee:

All teams must pay an entry fee of \$250

Deadline:

The deadline for entry is May 31, 2010

The tournament is open to the first 16 teams that have registered and made the full payment

Organizer will contact the team when registration forms are received

Payment Method:

In order to be considered eligible, an entry fee made payable by cheque to Sing Fai Sports Club must be accompanied with the registration form. There is no refund except for a cancelled event or a written notification being sent to the Committee before the deadline.
